Session 4

- Chairs and scribes stay but members seek a different group, preferably with a mix of expertise.
- Chair/scribe will summarise assessment of progress, what has been learned good and bad, what is needed now to make a difference and what would members see as top 3 priorities.
- Then ask new members to sense-check this and respond/offer alternative views ... but input in a structured manner

Generally,

- You will have a Chair and a scribe. Record the key scores, main headlines of agreement and disagreement, uncertainties, needs, targets, drivers, outcomes etc.
- Agree who if not the chair/scribe should feed back to the plenary meeting
